### The B.L.E.S.S. Strategy

#### L. - Listen (Luke 18)

B - begin with prayer  
L - listen  
E - eat  
S - serve  
S - story

I. \_\_\_\_\_ from Jesus (Luke 18:35-40)

1. Don't be \_\_\_\_\_ "bring him to me" (v. 40)

- People were always crowding Jesus.
- In our case, maybe a cell phone or something else.

2. Don't \_\_\_\_\_ things

(John 5:5-6) "Do you wish to get well?"

(Luke 18:39-43) "What do you want me to do for you?"

II. \_\_\_\_\_ from James (James 1:18-20)

- James' letter has been called "Christianity in shoe leather."
- verse 18 - speaks of our new birth  
verse 19 - speaks of our new behavior
- You'll notice 3 commands in verse 19 . . .
  - A. quick to hear
  - B. slow to speak
  - C. slow to wrath

1. "Quick to hear" - \_\_\_\_\_!

- We need to be careful though, in both how we listen and to what we listen to.
 

"So take care how you listen" (Luke 8:18)

"Take care of what you listen to" (Mark 4:24)
- Question: How does God speak to us?

Answer: In many ways but 3 are most common:

A. through the \_\_\_\_\_

Ask yourself, is there:

- a. a lesson to learn?
- b. a blessing to enjoy?
- c. a commend to obey?
- d. a sin to avoid?
- e. a new truth to carry with me?

B. through the \_\_\_\_\_

- God holds us accountable for not only what we heard but what we would have heard had we listened!

C. through the \_\_\_\_\_

- In talking with people, Dave Ferguson encourages the use of the 4 H's
  - History - Tell me your story, where did you grow up?
  - Heart - What's your favorite . . . (team, restaurant etc.)
  - Habits - What are you into?
  - Hurts - How are you doing with . . . (the situation)

2. Slow to speak - \_\_\_\_\_

- Most of us talk too much!  
(Proverbs 10:19) (Proverbs 17:27-28)
- Rabbi's would teach:

"Man has 2 ears and one mouth. The ears are made to always be open but the mouth is made so it can be closed, and the tongue is enclosed in a den behind ivory bars - the teeth."

(Psalm 141:3)

- Swift to hear and slow to speak go hand in hand.  
You can't hear if you are talking!
