## Hymns to Hack It #7 "In A Dry And Weary Land" Psalm 63

- It seems that David wrote a Psalm on just about every experience he had. We too should be constantly learning something new about the Lord through <u>our</u> experiences.
- The subscript says Psalm 63 was written when he was in the wilderness. There were 2 such occasions as a young man and later as King of Israel. According to verse 11, this time was as king.

(II Samuel 15:23) (Psalm 63:1-11)

Note: Though David's son may have deserted him, his Father is still very much present.

II. David's	(v. 4-8)
•	note the "right watch" (v. 6) (Mark 13:35)
•	note "clings" (v. 8); means "a close and intimate relationship"; same thought as Genesis 2:24 - "Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave, cling to his wife"
III. David's	(v. 9-11)
•	What does the future hold for David (and us)?
	Two things:
	A (v. 9 & 19)
	(Romans 8:35-37)
	(II Corinthians 2:14)
	<ul> <li>We are more than conquerors and He always leads us in triumph!</li> </ul>
	B (v. 11)
	• We are kings too!
	<ul> <li>we are kings and priests (Revelation 1:6) KJV</li> <li>we reign in Christ (Romans 5:17)</li> </ul>
